# FABULOUS FAMILY RECIPES

These recipes are from **Helen Lundquist** (a/k/a Mama, Sister, Grandma), and are some that Grandma Doran made for years and years.

## SATURDAY NIGHT SUPPER

Originally, it just had the meat, navy beans and potatoes, but after Helen graduated from college (as a dietician and food expert) she talked Grandma into adding carrots and sometimes green beans.

Short ribs of beef Potatoes cut in 1/2 or 1/4 pieces 1 pound navy beans carrots cut in 3" pieces

Method: Soak beans in water over night. (can add 1 tsp. baking soda-for easier digestion). Next morning pour off liquid and rinse. Put short ribs in with beans and cover with water. Cook slowly all morning until mid-day. In pan (9 x 16 x 2) put meat in middle of pan, potatoes on one side of meat, the navy beans on other side. Put pieces of carrots throughout contents of pan.

Bake slowly all day. Usually this is done around 6 p.m. Serve with catsup.

# HAPPY BIRTHDAY CAKE

This recipe, also from **Helen Lundquist**, has been in the family for many years. It's a great cake; and a good way for some of our younger family cooks to learn the rewards of baking a "scratch" cake over a packaged mix! (us older folks, too!)

2-1/2 cups SIFTED Swans Down cake flour

1-1/2 cup suger

3 tsp. Calumet baking powder

1 tsp. salt

1/2 cup shortening (Crisco) room temperture

1 cup milk

2 eggs unbeaten

1 tsp. vanilla

Method: (1) place sifted flour in sifter; add suger, baking powder and salt

- (2) Stir shortening in bowl to soften. Sift in dry ingredients. Add 3/4 cup milk. Beat 2 minutes at medium speed of mixer.
- (3) Add eggs, vanilla and rest of milk and beat 1 minute.
- (4) Pour into two 9" layer pans lined and greased and bake for 25 minutes at 350°.
