Another one of our loved family, Frank Edward Doran, was called home to our Father last April. His wife, Louise Doran, and daughter, Susan Lindsey, sent us the following tribute to their husband and father, and our grandfather, uncle, brother, friend.

FRANK EDWARD DORAN July 20, 1912 - April 25, 1992

Frank Edward Doran was born July 20, 1912, to U.G. and Annie Doran at his grandparents home at 1701 S. Ervay Street in Dallas, Texas. He died April 25, 1992, at the age of 79. Frank was named for his maternal and paternal grandfathers - Frank Edward and was the middle child of U.G. and Annie. He was preceded in death by his brother, Stanley, and sister, Helen Doran Lundquist. His two younger sisters, Margaret Griffin and Katherine Wise, survive. Frank attended Dallas schools--Fannin, Bryan High and Woodrow Wilson. He went to work in the '30s as a runner for the Dallas National Bank. He was inducted into the army on May 4, 1942, and served three and one-half years. When he returned from the service, he went into the real estate business with his cousin, Allen Graham for a while, but banking was in his blood so he went back to the First National Bank and worked as a Vice President in the loan department until he retired in 1977.

Frank was married to Louise Elmore on September 17, 1938. They were married for 53 years, 7 months, 8 days. Frank and Louise had two daughters, Susan Louise (7-24-44), and Sally Ann (6-26-47). Susan married Roger Lindsey June 22, 1968, and they have two daughters, Shannon Michelle (8-19-74) and Erin Louise (1-30-78). Sally married Tom Marr and they had one daughter, Kimberly Anne Marr (10-24-70). Sally was killed in a hit-and-run accident on February 27, 1972. Frank and Louise raised Kimberly, who is single and lives and works in Mineola, New York.

Frank had many talents and hobbies. He played the organ until the wee hours of the morning while he could, he loved gardening and photography (made many home movies), and built all of his daughters and granddaughters fantastic doll houses with electric lights and all the fancies. He loved his family and was a devoted son, brother, husband, father, and grandfather. Thank you God for his wonderful life on this earth. We will surely miss him.


